- financial resources for scientific activities (research and educational projects, scientific contacts, participation in scientific events, ...),
- resources for counselling and administrative/management support of researchers and teachers.

International Relations

International Office:

- supports and develops international co-operations in the area of education,
- is responsible for central management of TUW budget for international relations.

EU research support:

- provides services at the TU Wien and supports both researchers and administrative staff in preparing and carrying out EU research projects:
 - information on EU research programmes,
 - counselling preparation and management of EU research programmes,
 - etc.



International Office - staff

Staff members:

- 4 full time,
- 2 half time,
- 1 student assistant part time,
- 1 Bologna delegate part time.



International Office – tasks, services

Tasks:

- Financial management of TUW budget for int. relations;
- Central project management (Erasmus, Erasmus Mundus ECW, Joint Study, Tempus);
- Information and counselling on international programmes for education;
- Checking contracts for international projects for education
- Student services;
- Development of strategies for international cooperation in the area of education together with vice-rectors, deans, study deans, faculty delegates;
- Summer university.

Services:

- for incoming students,
- for outgoing students,
- for scientific staff members of TU Wien.



Int. Office – services for students

Services for incoming "program-students":

- Publish information brochure "Welcome Guide";
- Arrange housing (in cooperation with OeAD);
- Help with registration at TU Wien;
- Organise tutorials (in cooperation with student union);
- Organise social events (e.g. Welcome Evening);
- Build up network of students for students (Buddy Network).

Services for outgoing students:

- publish information brochures and folders;
- Personal counselling concerning "study abroad";
- Management of international student programmes;
- Organise "Study-abroad-fair and information events;
- Build up a network of academic advisers at departmental level (e.g. Erasmus co-ordinators).



Students

Figures:

- 23452 registered students at TU Wien in winter term 2009/10 (incl. bachelor, master, diploma, PhD),
- 23,3% students from abroad (av. Austria 12%),
- 245 bilateral agreements within ERASMUS,
- 2009: 24% of TUW graduates with study abroad experience,
- Mobility programmes 2009:
 - 408 "outgoings",
 - 636 "incomings".




Student scholarships

- National: individual programmes and university networks (e.g. Eurasia-Pacific, ASEA-Uninet),
- TU Wien:
 - Joint Study Programmes (ca 125000 €),
 - Short scientific activities and oriented courses in the framework of diploma/PhD theses (ca 95000 €),
 - Marietta Blau Grant (ca 10000 €);




Erasmus 2009





Joint Study Programmes 2009






Int. Office – services for staff

General aims for international cooperation:

- International co-operation shall play an important role in research and education;
- Use of synergies through participation in international research networks;
- Co-operation and competition with leading technical universities in Europe, especially from neighbouring countries;
- Recruiting/attracting "high potentials".



Development plan 2010+ (II)

Aims for international education:

- Increase of student mobility (master level and beyond) from and to research partners;
- Better guidance of students concerning study abroad by teaching staff;
- Establish international delegates on faculty level;
- Further development of joint- and double degrees;
- Promotion of summer schools.



Questionnaire

Questionnaire "International Education at TUW - results:

- General open minded attitude towards int. mobility programmes;
- Exchanges "quality instead of numbers";
- Recognition of studies abroad works well;
- New bachelor/master structure makes mobility more difficult;
- Connection between int. education and int. research should be improved;
- High value for teaching staff mobility, but problem with the time management;
- Positive image for joint degree programmes, but too time consuming;
- Stimulate the information and communication flow within the TUW.
